To be hospitable means "to be disposed to behave in a warm manner or to entertain with generous kindness."

It could also be described as creating a free and friendly space for people. Hospitality is NOT decorations and elaborate food.

Here are just a few examples:

Genesis 18:1-8, Abraham is shown caring for his guests.

Genesis 14:31-33, Laban is seen welcoming Abraham's servant.

2 Kings 4:8-10 gives us the example of the Shunamite woman who opened her home to Elisha.

Matthew 10:9-15, Jesus commanded His disciples to shun any home which did not show them hospitality AND equated hospitable treatment of others with treatment of Himself.

To *Lead* women to Christ

To *Develop* in women the skills of prayer, evangelism, stewardship, and social service

To *Involve* women in the work of the Chapel
