- young wives and mothers
- living in diverse locations making it challenging for them to connect easily/feeling isolated
- older women whose husbands are attending the schools
- women hurting and are dealing with a lot of turmoil in their families.
- women who are all over the place theologically (not grounded)
- Exhausted from consistent TDY/exercises
- An absence of the mature older ladies/ retirees
- Diverse but young mother majority
- Feeling alone
- Exhausting husband schedules
- Lack of community
- Families who need support.
- Drill sergeant wives who need support
- Retired families as well
- Lack of community/everyone leaves after work
- Isolated wives
- Tired and not wanting to volunteer
- Not enough board members for all the tasks
- Christ centered women
- women who don't know what Christ centered means
- hard working board members
- women wanting deeper studies
- retirees
- lower enlisted who feel very alienated
- CGSC students (Majors)
- wide diversity of ages and spiritual maturity
- challenging to connect with the younger women /fruitful connection is rare.
- Seasoned Christians hunger for depth
- younger ladies that need a safe place to be loved and fed 'milk'.
- large group with younger kids
- small group of faithful attendees/ remote.
- Primarily enlisted wives, but only a few of them attend chapel or PWOC.
- high turn over rate

- most husbands are going through flight school
- spouses new to the military in general
- wonderful group of retiree ladies
- a mixture of branches
- split evenly between enlisted and office wives and a few active duty
- families living in terrible housing/out around the city
- Christian women (spouses, active duty, contractors, civilians)
- a large portion of the board and the body is made up a brand new ladies
- a need for community
- a need for grounding in the Word to overcome present challenges
- a need for a greater understanding of prayer
- Lack of mentoring and building up a strong and supportive foundation for PWOC leadership roles
- Women constantly encouraging each other to get out and see something new
- variety of military branches
- vary greatly in age, stage of life, and experience with Christ
- new believers and mature Christian women
- a lack of mentorship, Biblical hospitality, communal prayer, and most importantly actually reading the Bible

- mothers with young children, homeschool moms, and women with retired spouses
- women willing and able to volunteer
- women looking for connection; to other women and/or to God
- good mix of ladies (spouses of AIT and mid-career training) - many women come and stay only a few months before they move away.
- some families who have been stuck here for years
- Growing base, transitional base
- Spouses of contractors who were prior service
- Almost all our ladies are moms, with lots of young kids dependent on childcare, but also plenty of school age kids
- We have a healthy population of retirees
- very few women come to us who aren't already Christian
- lack of emotional stability / the feeling of family.
- Need for peace and security during big career changes is a common desire
